To Whom It May Concern:

The purpose of this letter is to show our support for the proposed changes to the Industrial Tax Exemption Program ("ITE") Rules (LAC 13:1. Chapter 5) as currently written. Our firm, SumIt Credits, LLC ("SumIt") is in the business of assisting companies with comparing and analyzing costs associated with the process of selecting an ideal site for a new project or expansion project. As part of this work, we as provide services to companies to manage the compliance with any incentives that are awarded by the state or locals for the selected final site. Our comparison and analysis reports typically entail looking at the tax costs and any incentives to reduce such tax costs.

Unfortunately, Louisiana, has a very high sales tax cost, a high property tax cost (one of only a handful of states left that assess property tax on inventory), and a moderately high-income tax when compared to other states, especially our neighboring states. The ITE program has been VERY instrumental in mitigating the overall high taxes in Louisiana as compared to other states, especially Texas. Without this program it would be very difficult to lure projects to Louisiana instead of Texas, in our opinion.

We understand and respect that changes that have been made to the ITE program over the past two years and have worked to comply with the new rules. It has been very difficult and time consuming for us, and for company representatives, to attend numerous local meetings to get the necessary local approvals under the current rules. On average it is requiring 3-5 separate visits and meetings to get the necessary approvals. Although we will do whatever is required to follow the rules, we are very supportive of the new proposed rules to change the locals input from requiring a resolution, to merely giving them the option to deny what has been awarded. This should reduce the amount of time and streamline the approval process greatly, and we are 100% in favor of this. Further, some local parishes, haven't wanted to even vote on any ITE proposals, because the council members are uneasy about the negative ramifications (regardless of how the vote) that it will have on them with their constituents. One particular parish was very happy to learn of the new rules which would allow them to give ITE exemptions to their local businesses, but without having to put a vote on record, and complicate this with other tax issues they must consider.

In conclusion, under the current rules, we are seeing a huge slowdown in the approval process, that could affect future projects, or cause some existing project to not get any local ITE approvals. This could be devastating for Louisiana's economic development image. Thus, we are fully supportive of Sec. Pierson's proposed rules AND the proposed timeline to get these implemented as soon as possible, which would require no changes. Although we are a little concerned about the change in the exemption percentage up front, we understand the compromise that is needed, at this time, to help the state get to a better place

Dear Don:

St. Mary Parish in general supports the changes to the ITEP Process Rules particularly Exhibit A and the magnitude and term of the exception.

St. Mary Parish Government has approached all the taxing authorities and received their endorsement by resolution and letter for the Sheriff. As a rural parish the taxing authorities have agreed that the Parish President can use their authority to participate in the ITEP Program subject can to the following conditions:

- 1. The Parish Economic Development Department would run the economic impact model (IMPLAN) and if the benefits outweigh the incentives the Parish President must
- 2. Inform and <u>discuss</u> the outcome of the model with the taxing authority designees, in economic development terms, prior to forwarding the local endorsement of the Parish to LED.

The Parish process would be more efficient and cut off some 30-60 days of the process with Parish endorsements in hand prior to LED review. It will also allow the parish to give the potential applicant a 95% chance he can receive this ITEP for St. Mary Parish.

St. Mary Parish and other parishes that have already a process in place or will develop one in the near future would like you to consider a <u>local option</u>. In the St. Mary Parish case the local authority designees are fully on board via their project endorsements.

The parish is giving the incentive and the State receives benefits from income taxes, sales tax, etc.

90% or more of the ITEP requests begin at the Parish level and are less than \$10 million in capital investments.

Some questions for LED

- Will LED perform the rigorous analysis of the IMPAN model? Or some other model? What will the model outputs look like?
- Will LED forward the detailed analysis to the C&I Board with recommendations to approve?
- What will the C&I Board send to the taxing authorities? A letter of approval?
- Don't you think it is important to explain the benefits of a project to the taxing authorities in economic development terms and not just sending a letter of approval for their consideration?
- Why not consider a capital improvement cut off \$10 million and below as a local option only?

St. Mary Parish would appreciate your endorsement of a local option.



While we have submitted a letter of support we feel there is still work to be done to keep the ITEP incentive tool competitive, predictable, and simplified for both businesses seeking a manufacturing location and local governing authorities working to build a solid tax base.

Items for clarification

Thank you for the opportunity to weigh in regarding the proposed rule changes that will affect your department's administration of the ITEP. LABI believes these changes offer some improvement to the program's operation. We would urge the Board of Commerce and Industry, acting as a rules committee of the whole, to adopt them.

That said, LABI, like you and the Board, will monitor the affect these changes will have on our state's manufacturing activity. We noted with great disappointment that the national Bureau of Economic Analysis reported Louisiana's GDP for nondurable goods manufacturing last year fell .9 percent, the worst decline of any state. In the same period, GDP for durable goods grew a meager .04 percent, leaving Louisiana lagging all but 7 other states.

Louisiana's struggles in these sectors occurred at a time when most states enjoyed generally robust GDP growth in both categories. Our ability to join the rest of the nation in the current economic recovery will turn in large measure on our ability to attract new manufacturing establishments along with new projects to existing plants. LABI believes it is critical that the state's ITEP be the economic development tool it was intended to be. Therefore, we further urge you and the Board to continue to work on enhancing the ITEP rules in other respects going forward.

The difficulties that beset the ITEP last year discouraged some companies from giving Louisiana proper consideration for their projects. Indeed, some chose to shelve their projects altogether or to situate them at plants they have operating in other states. We will never know how many company executives excluded Louisiana from any consideration at all in reaction to the complications that followed in the wake of the changes made to the program in 2016. Hitting the reset button is a welcome development, but we insist that the job is not finished, and further refinement of the new approaches to the ITEP's operation is very much needed.

Again, thank you for allowing us to provide our perspective on the proposed rule changes. LABI looks forward to the continued opportunity to work with you and your department for the benefit of this important economic development tool.

Thanks Mrs. Bourgeois. I do appreciate you listening to our concerns, however, it was the overall opinion that we were not heard. There seemed to be very little response other that "you are just going to have to live with it." It begs the question, what is the purpose of public meetings and written comments, if the concerns are not going to be considered?

As of right now, the Assessors have only one main concern, that a company can be partially exempt in one sense and not exempt at all in another. The scenario where all of the "Big 3" act in the same manner, either granting the exemption or not granting it, does not really concern us. Yes, we will have to do some software and procedural changes to make this work, but we can do that. And are more than willing to do that. It is the scenario where one or more of the "Big 3" grant the exemption and others do not that really concerns us. That is both a major software change and procedural change, and cannot be accomplished overnight.

As of right know, Assessors are working on the ITEP situation on two fronts, the LED front (rules and regulations) and the Louisiana Tax Commission front (reporting the exemption and dollars exempted). It is a momentous task.

I am going to attempt to explain the Assessors thoughts, in layman's terms, in hopes that a light bulb will come on and someone (other than Assessors) says "I get it." Most people who don't do what we do, assume that the property taxes are calculated on the "Assessed Value." They are not. They are calculated on the "Taxable Value." Sometimes they are one in the same, sometime they are not. When there is no exemption of any kind, the "Assessed Value" and the "Taxable Value" are one in the same. I will give you two simple examples as it would appear on a tax roll:

| Assessed Value: | \$30,000.00 | Assessed Value: | \$30,000.00 |
|-----------------|-------------|-----------------|-------------|
| Exemption: | \$7,500.00 | Exemption: | \$00.00 |
| Taxable Value: | \$22,500.00 | Taxable Value: | \$30,000.00 |

All Millage Rates that apply to an assessment point at **ONE** "Taxable Value," for each assessment, to generate the amount of taxes that are going to be paid. In the scenario that is in the current LED rules, there could be multiple "Taxable Values" for one assessment. This creates a significant problem in programming. And will create an equally significant problem in reporting the numbers to the LTC in a format where it can be figured what is exempt and how much money is being exempted.

I personally have over 20 taxing bodies, about twice that in separate millage rates (many have more than one). Many Assessors have many more taxing bodies than I do. We will have to program a scenario of either applying the exemption or not applying it for each one of these, and every possible combination that could occur. For me, it will be in the hundreds. For example, I have eight different Fire Districts. I will have to program the possibility of any one of them having an exemption of 80%-20% exemption or no exemption at all. That in and of itself is 16 different combinations that would have to be created, ,just in case the exemption occurs in that Fire District. I can't just sit back and wait for the

possibility that it might, I have to be prepared if it does. May I point out, that all of this has to be done, for a handful of properties (in comparison to the rest of the properties) in most parishes.

On behalf of North Louisiana Economic Partnership (NLEP), we want to express to you our appreciation for the hard work you and the LED staff have done to prepare a new set of guidelines to govern the Industrial Tax Exemption Program (ITEP).

We believe it is important that guidelines be adopted as soon as possible to put Louisiana back onto a course that is simple to understand and a process that is straightforward to follow. The changes you have recommended are a good step towards simplifying the ITEP approval process.

As a regional economic development organization, we still have the challenge of communicating to companies what property tax incentive our communities will approve. Lacking that, our parishes and LED are unable to market our parishes effectively to manufacturing companies. Even after the adoption of these changes Louisiana still lacks predictability and consistency. Manufacturers have the benefit of clarity and predictability from competing states about what they will receive as incentives if they choose their communities. That is not so in Louisiana without clear, local-established criteria, and we request your help in working towards that even beyond the proposed revision. 
